Let Our Voices Be Heard -- Build a Dedicated Hike & Bike Path Linking New Salem Historic Site with Petersburg



The Illinois Department of Transportation will be hosting an open house public meeting for Phase 1 roadway improvements to IL 97 and IL 123.

The meeting will not have a formal presentation but exhibits and maps will be available for viewing. IDOT representatives and consultants from the engineering firm Thouvenot, Wade and Moerchen will be available to answer questions and gather public input about the project.

Any residents interested in this project are invited to attend Tuesday, **June 21, 2022** from 4:00-6:00pm at the PORTA High School.

For years we've advocated for a safe hike / bike path linking New Salem State Historic Site with Petersburg. With the resurfacing of Rte. 97 on the horizon, this is the perfect time to ensure this goal is realized.

It's important that we show strong public support for a hike / bike path along Rte. 97. Please attend the public information meeting on Tuesday, June 21 from 4:00 to 6:00 PM at the PORTA High School, and encourage your friends, family and neighbors to attend as well.

We are also advocates of a more walkable Petersburg. Trails & Greenways supports the Petersburg mayor in his request for installation of two pedestrian right-of-way cross-walks along Rte. 97 at Douglas and Jackson Streets (main E/W streets downtown that cross Rte. 97). Having traffic stop for pedestrians in crosswalks will make walking in downtown Petersburg safer and more enjoyable for residents and visitors.

A Look Back at FY 22



The first year of the Habitat Restoration Project at New Salem State Historic Site was a huge success. Beginning November 5, 2021 and ending February 27, 2022, 19 volunteers spent 300+ volunteer hours cutting, stacking and treating honeysuckle within the interior of the Cardinal Trail loop (plus some). Karen Erchinger, with a little help, removed the honeysuckle from the area along the backside of the Lincoln Statue near the New Salem entrance, and native trees and shrubs were planted. And, during the springs of '21 & '22, 18 volunteers (including a small group of young 4-H kids and their folks pulled 108 bags of garlic mustard! On April 15 this year, 3 project volunteers assisted the IDNR with a prescribed fire.
